

Outstanding Exhibitor for Wayne County Junior Fair

The Outstanding Exhibitor Award program was developed to recognize youth who go above and beyond in their species both in and out of the show ring! Previously we had Outstanding Exhibitor in Horse, Dairy, Beef, and Swine. Now we will be offering it in all species! The Animal Science Education and Evaluation Committee has made some changes to the way the Outstanding Exhibitor score will be calculated and also increased the number of species that will be able to participate. Previously the OME score was figured by combining the market class placing, skillathon score, and showmanship placing.. Now the score will include points for participation, Outstanding Exhibitor Exam score (The OEE will be offered at the first night of Skillathon), Project Book, Showmanship placing , and Breed or Market Class Placing. - **Participation in outside activities (15%)** **15 POINTS**
Member must participate in at least 2 of these activities to receive the full 15 points. 7.5 points will be awarded for each of the first 2 activities completed. 1 bonus point will be awarded for every additional activity participated in (up to a maximum of 2 bonus points) Participation form must be filled out for each activity and turned into the Extension office or boreman.21@osu.edu by September 1
 - attend a species-specific clinic or event in or outside of the county
 - exhibit a species-specific animal at the Ohio State Fair (*must have checked your animal in with the appropriate department at Ohio State Fair*)

Member receives 35% of their total OEE score (out of 100 points) toward their OEE score for Outstanding Exhibitor purposes. Convert their score to a percentage to 2 decimals. (i.e. OEE score of 95 = 33.25 points. $95 * 35\% = 33.25$)
- **Project Book (10%)** **10 POINTS**
Member receives a score out of 10 for an updated project book. Book will be judged for content on the same day as Skillathon, if you don't submit a book you cannot compete in OME, OBE, or ODE

1 Participation in outside activities (10%)

15 POINTS

Member must participate in at least 2 of these activities to receive the full 15 points. 7.5 points will be awarded for each of the first 2 activities completed. 1 bonus point will be awarded for every additional activity participated in (up to a maximum of 2 bonus points) A participation form must be filled out for each activity and turned into the Extension office or boreman.21@osu.edu by September 1

- attend a species-specific clinic in or outside of the county
- attend a species-specific event (proof of participation is required, each committee will determine what specific events count toward their Outstanding Exhibitor Award)
- exhibit a species-specific animal at the Ohio State Fair (must have checked your animal in with the appropriate department at Ohio State Fair)
- participate in Ohio State Fair Skillathon for the species you are competing in for Outstanding Exhibitor (must be on list that Ohio State submits to counties)
- Attend a dog show

2 Outstanding Exhibitor Exam (OEE)

35 POINTS

Member receives 35% of their total Skillathon score (out of 100 points) toward their Skillathon score for Outstanding Exhibitor purposes. Convert their score to a percentage to 2 decimals. (i.e. Skillathon score of 95 = 33.25 points. $95 * 35\% = 33.25$)

3 Project Book (10%)

10 POINTS

Member receives a score out of 10 for an updated project book. Book will be judged for content on the same day as Skillathon – not just that they have the pages completed.

- **Participation in outside activities BONUS (up to 10 bonus POINTS)**
- There will be bonus points based on how many fun shows you have attended this year or if you participated at the Ohio State Fair. With a maximum of 10 points. If you participated in fun shows you will get 3 points per show and then 1 additional if you attend 3 or more fun shows. $3+3+3+1 = 10$. If you participated in the Ohio State Fair you will receive 10 bonus points. If you participate in Skillathon and or project interview judging you can also receive 3 points for each of those events. Participation form must be filled out for each activity and turned into the Extension office or boreman.21@osu.edu by September 1

- **Outstanding Exhibitor Exam (OEE) (20%) 30 POINTS**
Member receives 20% of their total OEE score (out of 100 points) toward their OEE score for Outstanding Exhibitor purposes. Convert their score to a percentage to 2 decimals. (i.e. OEE score of 95 = 33.25 points. $95 * 35\% = 33.25$)

- **Project Book (10%) 10 POINTS**
Member receives a score out of 10 for an updated project book. Book will be judged for content on the same day as Skillathon, if you don't submit a book you can not compete in OME, OBE, OHE, or ODE

Member receives 30% of their total OEE score (out of 100 points) toward their OEE score for Outstanding Exhibitor purposes. Convert their score to a percentage to 2 decimals. (i.e. OEE score of 95 = 28.5 points. $95 * 40\% = 28.5$)
- **Project Book (10%) 10 POINTS**
Member receives a score out of 10 for an updated project book. Book will be judged for content on the same day as Skillathon, if you don't submit a book you can not compete in OME, OBE, Or ODE
- **Showmanship (40%) 40 POINTS**

Each exhibitor will select one animal to be shown in a mixed breed class on Tuesday after the colored breed show is finished. Exhibitors participating must be in their show whites. Alternate leadsmen will be permitted for this class, providing the exhibitor communicates with the committee and the leadsmen must be the same age or younger. There will be two classes - one for heifers and one for cows. Cows must be milked out before the start of their class. The placement in this class will be used for the 20% class placing portion of the award – not individual breed class placings.

EXAMPLES:

OME – Hog Example:

Susie Swine ford attended a swine clinic at the fairgrounds and has a signed statement that she was there. She also exhibited a Duroc barrow at the Ohio State Fair and participated in the State Fair Skillathon. She completed the Wayne Co Skillathon, where she received a score of 87 and a book score of 10. At the fair, she was 1st in her showmanship class and 2nd in her market class. Susie's score for OME would look like this:

OBE – Goat Example:

Brian Boer has attended a goat clinic, attended Champions Choice Goat Camp, exhibited at the Buckeye Showdown jackpot show, exhibited at the Ohio State Fair, and participated in the Ohio State Fair Skillathon. He received a 73 on his goat Skillathon at Wayne Co and book score of 9. At the fair, he was 2nd in his showmanship class, 1st in his 0-6 month bore doe class and 5th in his 13-24 month Boer doe class. Brian's OBE score would look like this:

Frequently asked Questions

How do I sign up for Outstanding Exhibitor?

To be considered eligible for this award you must take the exam on July 8th and make an Entry via Fairy Entry by August 1st

What if I cannot attend the July 8th date?

Please Contact the Extension Office as soon as you find out about the conflict to set up alternative testing time. You will have to come into the Extension Office to take your Exam before July 8. The exam will not be given after 9pm on July 8th.

My child has a learning disability and I am concerned an exam will affect their score negatively.

Our goal is for the test to be computerized and the exhibitor can select a button to have the computer read the test to them. If this function is not available at the time of testing, we will have readers available if they are requested before July 8th. For Potential other accommodations please contact the Extension office by June 1.

Will the Outstanding Exhibitor Exam count as my Skillathon Score?

Yes, if you complete the Outstanding Exhibitor Exam it will count as a completion for your Skillathon requirements! However there is a minimum score you must achieve to receive the credit. If you do not meet the minimum score you will be asked to complete Skillathon or project interview judging to receive credit (you will know after the exam if your score met the minimum requirements). We highly recommend that you participate in Skillathon to achieve your bonus points for the participation section.

Will I get a banner for a high Outstanding Exhibitor Exam?

No, if you want to receive a banner to be displayed at the fair you must still complete the Wayne County Skillathon or Project interview (we will be giving banners for project interview this year)

I have two breeding animals. Which score do you count?

We take the higher of the two scores to count toward your total. (Dairy has their own ODE specific class)

How do you break ties?

1st the test score, 2nd the book score, and 3rd the showmanship score

When will the Awards be presented?

For Poultry, rabbit, sheep, and goat these awards will be presented at 12:30 on Wednesday. For Beef and Swine those awards will be awarded at 8:00 am on Thursday. Dog will present at the End of the Dog show on Thursday. Dairy will present at the end of dairy showmanship and Horse will present their awards_____.

How many people will be awarded?

A total of 11 youth per species awarded will be awarded. The top 2 overall can be from any age division and then the top 3 from each age division (junior, intermediate, senior) will be awarded.
