# What's the Best Option for you!

## OPTION #1: Would you like to "turn" or resell the animal on the base market price?

This option allows you to recover a portion of your expense. The animal is sent to a terminal livestock market arranged by the Senior Fair Board and sold.

Sale programs are available as you register at the sale ring. If you would like to purchase an exhibitor's animal, simply raise your hand to make a bid when that exhibitor enters the sale ring. Bid until the price is higher than you wish to pay or you have won the bid. Then tell the auctioneer you would like to turn your purchase.

## OPTION #2:

Do you want to keep the meat from the animal you purchased?

Please note with this option – you will pay your auction prices AND a price to the processing company that is packaging the meat when you pick up. Please arrange processing before the day of the sale.
