## JUNIOR FAIR LIVESTOCK & DAIRY PRODUCTS AUCTION: WHAT IS IT?

Raising an animal as a livestock project is a valuable experience for any FFA or 4-H member. Projects are the foundation of these youth programs, teaching new agricultural practices and sound business principles. Accurate records are kept, listing production costs, labor input, and management practices. Through their livestock projects these young people gain the work experience necessary to acquire useful knowledge, skills, and responsibilities for life.

When you purchase an animal or dairy product at the Junior Fair Auction, you are buying prize livestock raised by Wayne County FFA and 4-H Club members or products representing dairy animals being raised by Wayne County youth.

The Junior Fair Auction gives these young people a chance to show a profit for their hours of hard work. The success of the auction is up to you. You can help these FFA and 4-H members while purchasing a quality product.

### HOW DO I REGISTER TO BUY AT THE LIVESTOCK/DAIRY PRODUCTS AUCTION?

To aid in registration of buyers on sale day, we ask that all new buyers fill out a registration card. Registration cards are available at the Extension Office at 428 W. Liberty St., in Wooster, in the Jr. Fair office during the fair, or at the registration table the day of the sale. Please note that I.D. will be required of ALL BUYERS. 2017 buyers have been automatically assigned a 2018 buyer number and must verify their contact information and pick up their bidder card / buyer number at the registration table during the sale.

**Only one buyer number will be allowed per lot, including champions.**

### HOW DO I BUY AN ANIMAL?

Sale programs will be available as you register at the sale ring. As each animal is led into the ring, the auctioneer will ask for bids. If you wish to buy that animal, raise your hand / buyer number. Keep raising your hand / buyer number until you are the last bidder, or until the bidding has gone as high in price as you are willing to pay. Whether or not you buy, your bidding will help the price the youth receive. Meat poultry and rabbits are sold by the pen.

Immediately following the purchase, buyers must inform the auctioneer if the animal is to be re-sold at another auction

called "turning the animal" or where the animal is to be processed.

When you are done buying you must report to the table to settle your account. **You must pay in cash or by check or credit card the day of the sale**, unless prior arrangements have been made with Tom Stocksdale, Farmers National Bank, 4192 Burbank Rd., Wooster, OH (330-464-7596). A 3% processing fee will be added to credit card transactions. If you have made arrangements to pay at a later date, you must still stop at the bank table to pick up your invoice(s). Individual 4-H and FFA members do not receive payment until all livestock has been paid for by all buyers.

### Re-sale of An Animal

If you inform the auctioneer that you want the animal re-sold (called "turned") through a livestock market, it will be sent to a livestock sale barn. You will be charged for the difference between your bid price and the "turn" price. (Market price that day).

Example: If you paid \$1.00 per pound for a 100-pound lamb and re-sold the animal at market price for 45 cents per pound (\$45), you only have an actual expense of \$55.00, which is tax deductible.

**All market steers, lambs, hogs, and goats must go to slaughter on a fair board designated truck to the processors listed below or if animal is turned must be trucked by fair board designated trucker.**

**Please Note:** Heffelfinger Meats will harvest (slaughter) all animals being custom processed by Butcher Block & Deli, Canaan Country Meats, Lone Star Butcher Shop & Deli, Marshallville Packing and Shreve Meats.

**All Poultry and Rabbits will be processed by Pleasant Valley Poultry** and will go to slaughter on a fair board designated truck. Poultry and Rabbits must be: 1) turned to Pleasant Valley or 2) processed and picked up by the buyer; processing to be paid by buyer.
