# What's the Best Option for you!

**OPTION #1: Would you like to “turn” or resell the animal on the base market price.**

This option allows you to recover a portion of your expense. The animal is sent to a terminal livestock market arranged by the Senior Fair Board and sold.

Sale Programs are available as you register at the sale ring. If you would like to purchase that exhibitor's animal simply raise your hand to make a bid when that exhibitor enters the sale ring. Bid until the price is higher than you wish to pay or you have won the bid. Then tell the auctioneer you would like to turn your purchase.
