My 4-H Story

The successes and disappointments that I have experienced in 4-H have led to my personal growth as a better leader, and have greatly influenced my career plans. Through these experiences, 4-H has been a great impact on my life. The impact of 4-H has led me to try to show younger members the fun and wonderful opportunities of 4-H; so in turn, they can have their own wonderful experiences in 4-H, too.

First of all, many of my successes have helped build me up to the positions I am in today. For example, it started when I took *Guide Dogs for the Blind* as a project. Through that project I learned to talk to groups easier, and felt myself getting more involved in 4-H that year. The next year, through the pressure of two good friends, I got involved in many county level 4-H activities. Since then, I have been very involved in 4-H and enjoy every minute of it. I feel, to have success in anything, you must enjoy it. The success with my animals, and the joy they bring to me has kept me in 4-H, though disappointments during my early years in 4-H discouraged me.

The disappointments, though, have helped me grow. The first big disappointment came when I first started 4-H. Nobody took notice of me and I felt out of place. The older kids had their cliques and would not talk to the younger kids. This experience helped show me not to ignore anyone in the club; everyone should feel welcome. Another disappointing experience, just recently, was Leadership Day at the State Fair in 1997. I recieved a letter, telling me to arrive at the very beginning of the day, even though the time slot for my presentation was not until later that afternoon. When other participants and I arrived, no one in charge was there to check us in. Later, during my time slot, we (the participants) split into large groups to tell each

other about our projects. The other participants mumbled when they gave their presentations, and talked to others when it was not their turn. These people helped me grow as a leader, in that, I now make sure that I do not talk during others' presentations, and I speak up when I am giving mine.

Lately, every 4-H activity has helped me mature into a better leader. For example, while also at the State Fair, before my presentation, I talked to a woman who was curious about my display and the activities I am involved in. Talking to her helped enforce what I knew about my leadership project. Secondly, my recent election to the position of President of the Junior Leadership Club will help strengthen my leadership skills. Previously, I have only resided over groups numbering less than 45. This position will help me in the future; such as, leading larger groups that may occur in college or the work force.

My school and career plans have also been directly influenced by 4-H. Right now I am not sure what I want to do in college, but I do know that in the future I want to work with animals. Through this, I have decided to major in animal science or agriculture, and plan to go from there. My goats and sheep throughout the years have had a great influence on my lifestyle. I love being around them all the time and want to continue working with animals throughout my life.

Through the activities and experiences I have had in 4-H, I have grown into the person I am today. I treasure these memories, and hope to help some other young members have memories of 4-H that they will treasure, too. I aspire to do this through being a leader and role model to the younger members.


