The Star Club program is not a competition, but a standard of excellence for all clubs to strive for. Every club can earn points during the year (January through September). Star Clubs will be recognized at the 4-H Recognition Banquet in November. Prizes will be awarded to clubs that earn this special recognition! Please note: you may attach additional pages or documents to this application to verify points earned.

There is a maximum of 2,784 points available and small clubs (5-35 members) must earn at least 1,000 points to qualify, medium size clubs (36-70 members) must earn at least 1,200 points to qualify and large clubs (71 and more members) must earn at least 1,350 points to qualify as a Star Club in 2024.
