What to bring to camp – Pack everything in a duffel bag or tote (not suitcase)

Camp Forms!

- Health form (if you have been notified)
- Camp Ohio Waiver Form
- Dismissal policy
- Scuba Form (if applicable)

Clothes:

- Jacket or Sweatshirt
- Raincoat
- Swimwear
- Warm Clothing for Evenings (x3)
- Cool Clothing for daytime (x4)
- Socks & under garments (x5-8)
- Sleep wear
- Nice Dark Jeans or Khakis and a nice shirt, blouse, or skirt for last night dinner – like the nicest clothes you would wear for showing or a concert at the county fair to wear at dinner on the last night of camp!

Shoes:

- Tennis shoes/Walking shoes
- Old shoes that can get wet/dirty
- Shower shoes (Only used in shower or going to pool)

Bedding:

- Twin sheet
- Sleeping bag or blankets
- Pillow

Hygiene/Toiletries:

- Towels (x2) and washcloths
- Soap & Shampoo
- Toothbrush and Toothpaste

Other items:

- Sunscreen
- Non-aerosol bug repellent
- Postcards/Letters with postage
- Flashlight

<u>ALL MEDICATION MUST be turned in to the camp nurse during check-in.</u> Please have it labeled with your name and specific dosing instructions and placed in a tightly sealed plastic bag.

What NOT to bring to camp:

- Knives of any kind
- Guns of any kind
- Weapons or Explosives of any kind
- Food or beverage

- Electronic toys
- Cell phone
- iPod or MP3 players
- Fireworks
- Jewelry

 Any items of value (Items can and do become lost or misplaced!)

Parents:

Participation: Due to COVID Restrictions there is no "part-time" camper participation. No campers may leave for baseball, cheerleading camp, etc. and then return. All campers are expected to fully participate in camp from their scheduled arrival time on June 30th through their scheduled departure time on July 3rd unless released for medical, emergency, or behavioral reasons.

Food at camp: In addition to 3 meals, each camper will be provided with snacks and drink items each evening (this is included in the camp fee). No extra food, drink, or souvenirs will be available for purchase by campers during camp. <u>Do not send food!</u> **Food in the cabins attracts rodents.** *Any food found will be discarded.*

Blisters: A potential problem at camp each year is blisters on campers' feet. Please be sure to stress to your child that it is extremely important to wear socks and shoes during the entire week. Wearing shoes at all times is strongly enforced at camp.

Lost Clothing and Other Personal Items: Lost articles are another camp nuisance. To prevent loss of your child's items, print your child's name on every item he/she brings to camp.

Bug Bites: Mosquito bites are fairly common, so be sure that some kind of repellent is packed. Be sure it is a <u>non-aerosol</u> type.

Camp address:

Picking up your kids: Please be on-time, picking your child up, on the last day of camp. Emergencies are certainly understood but remember that your children are anxious to see you and they become worried when no one is there to meet them. Thank you!

Forms: These forms will be collected within the registration line. If you need copies of any forms – please visit http://wayne.osu.edu/camp! We must have complete forms and any medications before your child is permitted to stay at camp.

Camp Theme: The theme this year is "Hawaiian Cowboy" The counselors have planned many fun activities including campfire evening entertainment, luau parties, games, and more. Be sure to pack something a little nicer to wear for our last night dinner and evening program.

COVID Restrictions / Protocols: While the CDC, Governor, and OSU administration have ended most COVID restrictions and protocols there are still some that remain in place for 4-H Camp. Below is a quick summary of the key ones you should be aware of:

- Facemasks are not required to be worn inside or outside at 4-H camp
- Facemasks are strongly recommended for those who are not yet fully vaccinated (strongly recommended means the individual chooses to wear a mask or not)
- Everyone who feels more comfortable continuing to wear a mask is encouraged to do so; and there should be no stigma attached to this personal choice and no comments, questioning, or shaming of those who are wearing a mask.
- Counselors will ask campers each day how they are feeling and if they are experiencing any COVID symptoms such as fever, cough, loss of taste or smell, etc. Anyone exhibiting COVID symptoms during camp will be isolated and parents contacted and expected to pick them up immediately
- Extensive cleaning and sanitizing procedures will be in place throughout camp
- As recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics, Pediatricians can advise families on whether it is safe
 for a child to attend camp based on his or her medical history and should make sure the child is up to date on
 vaccines.
- If a staff member, counselor, or camper has a persistent fever of 100.4 degrees or higher or any other COVID-19 symptoms OR they have been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 or is suspected of having COVID-19, they will receive a refund and will not be allowed to attend camp.
- Parents will be required to sign and turn in at camp the enclosed special COVID Acknowledgement Form.
